1. ACTION REQUIRED

- 1.1 Parliament is respectfully invited to consider and approve tax incentives for the implementation of the **One District One Factory (1D1F)** programme.
- 1.2 At its Thirty-sixth meeting held on Thursday, 27th June, 2018, Cabinet considered and approved the request for tax incentives under the One District One Factory (1D1F) flagship programme as indicated above for consideration of Parliament.

2. BACKGROUND

- 2.1 The "One District One- Factory" programme is a key component of the industrial Transformation Agenda of the Government. The Government's role in this programme is to facilitate the establishment of District Enterprises by creating the enabling environment including the provision of infrastructure such as access roads, water and electricity.
- 2.2 The programme is a private sector led initiative which means that factories to be established under the programme will be owned and managed by private investors. Government can however invest up to thirty percent (30%) equity in enterprises that require its participation.
- 2.3 The programme aims at establishing at least one medium to large scale factory in all the 254 Districts in the country. This means that a District could have more than one factory depending on its resource base. The emphasis on medium to large scale is due to the fact that the enterprises to be established are expected to impact positively and significantly on the economies of the Districts including creation of jobs, stable income for the residents and improved livelihoods.

3. 1D1F OBJECTIVES

The programme is designed to achieve basically the following objectives:

- i. To create massive employment particularly for the youth in rural and periurban communities, thereby improve levels and standard of living, as well as reduce rural-urban migration.
- ii. To add value to the natural resources of each District and exploit the economic potential of each District based on its comparative advantage.
- iii. To ensure even and spatial spread of industries and thus stimulate economic activity and growth in different parts of the country.
- iv. To promote exports and increase foreign exchange earnings to support the Government's development agenda, as well as reduce the volume of imports through import substitution.

4. EXPECTED BENEFITS

- 1. The anticipated job creation under the initiative in all the 254 Districts in the country would curb the migration of the youth from the rural areas to urban areas.
- II. Government revenue would be enhanced by way of Personal Income Taxes, Corporate Taxes and Value Added Tax in the long term when companies have exhausted the five-year tax holidays granted them.

5. JUSTIFICATION FOR GOVERNMENT ACTION

- 5.1 The slow growth of the industrial sector in Ghana could be largely attributed to the lack of targeted incentives by Government to make industrial production competitive and attractive to the private sector.
- 5.2 it is in this vein that Government is determined to ensure that the best investment climate exists to attract the needed investments into the manufacturing sector. This requires that appropriate incentives and regulations are put in place to create a favourable environment within which businesses can thrive and also protect the interests of shareholders. The experience of some of the most advanced economics in the world, point clearly to the fact that, targeted and well packaged incentives along the value chain are critical in attracting investments into strategic and viable areas of the manufacturing sector.
- 5.3 Against this background, Government has made the under-listed commitments and reinforced same in the Coordinated Programme of Economic and Social Development Policies (2018-2024).
 - a. Pursuing aggressive -industrialization and value-addition to agricultural produce;
 - b. Providing tax and related incentives for manufacturing businesses in sectors such as agro-processing, light industries, pharmaceuticals, petrochemicals, garments and textiles;
 - c. Providing a reliable and cost-effective mix of energy supply for businesses;
 - d. Providing the necessary incentives for private sector participation in health service delivery;
 - e. Pursuing policies that will reduce interest rates;
 - f. Implementing policies that will reduce the cost of doing business;
 - g. Stabilizin g the currency;
 - h. Providing incentives to the hospitality and creative industries that will enable them create jobs;
 - i. Investing in skills training and apprenticeships; and
 - j. Promotir 1g exports, especially of value added agricultural produce and light manufacturers.

6. PROPOSED INCENTIVES FOR THE ONE DISTRICT ONE FACTORY (1D1F) INITIATIVE In order to attract more private sector investments in support of the 1D1F initiative, the following incentive packages are hereby proposed for the consideration and approval of Parliament:

A. Corporate Tax

Registered 1D1F Companies to enjoy tax holiday for the first five (5) years of operation.

B. Exemption of import duties and taxes on equipment, machinery, and parts.

I. An 1D1F entity whose plant, machinery or equipment and parts are not exempted or zero rated under the Customs Harmonised Code may submit an application for exemption from import duty, VAT, NHIL, GETFUND, and EXIM levy on the plant, machinery and equipment or parts at the Customs Division of Ghana Revenue Authority (GRA) via the GcNet online portal.

C. Existing Free zones incentives

1D1F companies which want to benefit from the Free Zone package shall register and benefit from incentives under the Free Zone Act, 1995 (Act 504).

7. ADMINISTRATION OF THE WAIVER

- 7.1 All 1D1F companies shall be required to register with the Ministry of Trade and Industry and the Ghana Revenue Authority for the purposes of the incentive. The list of registered companies shall be forwarded to the Ministry of Finance;
- 7.2 The companies shall submit to the Ministry of Finance the master list of items to be imported or procured locally for tax assessment of the materials and equipment excluding vehicles and non-project materials;
- 7.3 The exemption is not transferable to third parties;
- 7.4 The exemption shall cover the construction period for the factories and the five-year holiday period;

8. CONCLUSION

8.1 The "One District, One Factory" programme, presents a unique opportunity to fundamentally change the economy of each District and to create significant number of decent jobs. The proposed incentives are expected to accelerate the realisation of Government's vision of resource-based industrialisation, job creation and value addition for improved livelihoods and equal opportunity for all.

8.2 Parliament is therefore, respectfully requested to consider and approve the proposed incentives for effective and efficient implementation of the One District One Factory programme in line with Article 174 (2) of the 1992 Constitution. KEN OFORI-ATTA

REQUEST FOR APPROVAL OF INCENTIVES TO SUPPORT IMPLEMENTATION OF THE ONE DISTRICT ONE FACTORY (1D1F) PROGRAMME

Cabinet at its Thirty-sixth meeting held on Thursday, 28th June, 2018 considered a report of the Cabinet Committee on Economic Matters on the above Memorandum submitted by the Minister for Trade and Industry.

- 2. The Memorandum requested Cabinet to consider and recommend to Parliament for approval, incentives proposed for the implementation of the One District One Factory (IDIF) Programme.
- 3. Cabinet approved the Memorandum and recommended same to Parliament for consideration, subject to the inclusion of the following revisions:
 - a) Repatriation of dividends or net profit should be subject to existing foreign exchange regulations and approval by the Bank of Ghana.
 - b) Standardised interest rate to be charged by Participating Financial Institutions (PFIs) should not exceed 20% per annum; and the associated net interest rate to be paid by beneficiary companies should not exceed 10%.
 - c) Reduction of the tax holiday form ten years to five years after commencement of operations. The tax holiday may be renewed on application by the company, and subsequent approval by the Minister for Finance.
- 4. I should be grateful if you could take requisite action on the decision by Cabinet.

CONTEXT

- The concept of the One District One Factory (1D1F) is designed to transform the industrial landscape of the country and build the capacities of local enterprises to produce high quality products and services for both the local and foreign markets.
- The programme is private sector-led and open to both local and foreign investors. Partnerships between local and foreign investors are encouraged.
- ► Two Districts can collaborate to implement one project.
- It is not only new projects that can be classified as 1D1F enterprise. Existing projects that are seeking to expand their operations and which fit within the 1D1F framework can be adopted as 1D1F enterprises.
- When required, Government can partner a private sector investor to sponsor a 1D1F. project under a PPP arrangement.
- The Government's primary role is facilitation and support in the form of incentives, access to financing as well as access to infrastructure.

STRATEGIC OBJECTIVES OF 1D1F INITIATIVE

- To create massive employment particularly for the youth in rural and peri-urban communities, and thereby improve income levels and standard of living, as well as reduce rural-urban migration.
- To add value to the natural resources of each district and exploit the economic potential of each district based on its comparative advantage.
- To ensure even and spatial spread of industries and thereby stimulate economic activity in different parts of the country.
- To enhance the production of local substitutes for imported goods and thereby conserve scarce foreign exchange.
- To promote exports and increase foreign exchange earnings.

STATUS OF IMPLEMENTATION

The inception activities of the programme started in June 2017 when the Ministry placed advertisement requesting for Expressions of Interest (EOI) from the Business community and the public.

The actual implementation of the 1D1F programme commenced in the fourth quarter of the same year (2017) with the deployment of a Technical Support Group (Consultants/Specialists) to provide technical assistance for the implementation of the selected projects.

The progress made as at January 2019 are presented in the subsequent slides.

PROJECTS TO COMMENCE OPERATIONS BY END OF THE YEAR TO BE FINANCED UNDER THE CNBM FACILITY

- 22 flágships Large Scale Projects are to be financed under the MOTI-China National Building Materials (CNBM) \$400 Million Facility.
- The projects include Industrial Starch from cassava, Ethanol plant from cassava, Diaper plant, Vegetable oil, Rice Milling plant among others.

PIPELINE PROJECTS

■ **75** Project Proposals are undergoing financial appraisal by both Technical Support Group at the Ministry and the Credit Committees of the PFIs.

1. INCENTIVE FRAMEWORK FOR 1D1F INITIATIVE

- Corporate Tax
- Tax holiday of five (5) years after commencement of operations. The tax holiday may be renewed on application by the company and subsequent approval by the Minister for Finance.
- Exemptions, Waiver of Import Duties and Levies on Equipment, Machinery, Plants and Parts and Raw Materials.
- Industrial plants, machinery or equipment and parts imported for IDIF are exempted from payment of levies and Customs Import Duty under HS Codes chapter 82, 84, 85, and 98.
- An enterprise whose Plant, Machinery or Equipment and Parts are not zero rated under the Customs, Excise and Preventive Service Management Act, 1993 may submit an application for exemption from import duties and related charges on the plant, machinery or equipment at the Customs Division of Ghana Revenue Authority (GRA).
- 100% exemption from payment of direct and indirect duties and levies on all raw material imports for ID1F production and exports.
- Exemption from payment of withholding taxes from dividends; Relief from double taxation for foreign investors and employees.

Guarantees and Repatriation of Dividends

- Repatriation of dividends or net profit subject to existing foreign exchange regulations and approval by the Bank of Ghana.
- Guarantee against nationalization and expropriation of investments in 1D1F companies.
- 100% foreign owned companies with investment of USD700,000 and above can employ four (4) expatriate workers whilst 100% foreign owned companies with investment between USD500,000 and USD700,000 are allowed to employ three (3) expatriate workers.

OTHER INCENTIVES

Provision of Subsidy on Interest Rates for 1D1F Companies by Government

Standardized interest rates to be charged by 1D1F Participating Financial Institutions (PFIs) shall not exceed 20% per annum; associated net interest rate to be paid by beneficiary 1D1F companies shall not exceed 10%.

Insurance Risk Cover


 A special credit risk insurance guarantee scheme shall be established for 1D1F companies.

- THE MINISTRY HAS ESTABLISHED A TECHNICAL SUPPORT GROUP MADE UP OF EXPERIENCED CONSULTANTS AND SECTOR SPECIALISTS TO SUPPORT THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE ONE DISTRICT ONE FACTORY (1D1F) INITIATIVE.
 - IN THIS REGARD, TWO CONSULTANTS/SPECIALISTS HAVE BEEN ASSIGNED TO EACH OF THE SELECTED 1D1F ENTERPRISE PROJECT TO PROVIDE TECHNICAL ASISTANCE AT NO COST TO THE BUSINESS PROMOTER.
