GETFUND DISTRIBUTION FORMULA FOR FISCAL 2017

It is our honour and privilege, to submit, on behalf of the Board of Trustees of the Ghana Education Trust Fund (GETFund) the attached Distribution Formula of monies expected to accrue to the GETFund for the year 2017.

Total expected inflows for the year are projected at Gh¢790,224,149.00 (Seven Hundred and Ninety Million, Two Hundred and Twenty Four Thousand, One Hundred and Forty Nine Cedis). This is specified in the Budget Statement and Economic Policy of the Government for Fiscal 2017.

We request the kind approval of the **Distribution Formula** by this august House to facilitate the release and application of funds to the critical and strategic areas of the Education Sector in accordance with the provision(s) of the GETFund Act 581.

We are confident that Parliament will be able to give approval to the Formula.

GETFUND DISTRIBUTION FORMULA FOR FISCAL YEAR 2017

The **Board of Trustees** of the Ghana Education Trust Fund **(GETFund)** is required by provision(s) of **Act 581 Section 8(1)**: "There shall be established by the Board within the Fund accounts in respect of the following:

- a. Tertiary Education
- b. Second-cycle Education
- c. Basic Education
- d. Investment; and
- e. Other related aspects of education such as distance education, school and public libraries and special education.
 - (2) The Board shall submit annually to Parliament for approval a formula for the distribution of monies to the various accounts under subsection (1)"

to design and submit proposals allocating funds to the **Sub-Sectors**, **Agencies** and **Institutions** within the **Public Education Sector** through the mechanism of a **Distribution Formula** for consideration and approval by Parliament.

Funding allocations are made based on the Government's **Annual Budget**Statement and Economic Policy approved by Parliament for each fiscal year.

Mr. Speaker, an amount of Gh¢1,021,500,000.00 (One Billion, Twenty One Million, Five Hundred Thousand Cedis) was allocated to the GETFund for the 2016 fiscal year but the actual outturn was Gh¢948,941,349.33 (Nine Hundred and Forty Eight Million, Nine Hundred and Forty One Thousand, Three Hundred and Forty Nine Cedis, Thirty Three Pesewas) out of which Gh¢94,554,979.93 (Ninety Four Million, Five Hundred and Fifty Four Thousand, Nine Hundred and

Seventy Nine Cedis, Ninety Three Pesewas) remains outstanding as at today and expecting to be received soon.

For Fiscal year 2017, an amount of Gh¢790,224,149.00 (Seven Hundred and Ninety Million, Two Hundred and Twenty-Four Thousand, One Hundred and Forty-Nine Cedis) is expected to be received into the GETFund.

The Law further stipulates that some crucial factors related to Education delivery and development are taken into account in the process of preparing this Formula. These relevant factors are:

- promotion of the study of Mathematics, Science and Technology;
- advancement of female education;
- reduction in the high level of illiteracy in historically disadvantaged areas;
- promotion of Computer, Vocational and Technical Education and Training; and,
- equitable allocation of funds to the Districts at the Pre-Tertiary level of education.

All of these Sub-Sectors, together with the related critical factors received consideration and attention in the process of designing this Formula.

In this regard therefore, the structure of spending has been calibrated to support and achieve the following:

- expansion of access:
- improvement of quality; and
- closing of those social and spatial gaps that tend to generate inequities in the Education Sector, especially at the pre-tertiary level and, also in deprived and hard to reach communities.

FISCAL YEAR 2017

In fiscal year 2017, a total of Gh¢790,224,149.00 (Seven Hundred and Ninety Million, Two Hundred and Twenty-Four Thousand, One Hundred and Forty-Nine Cedis) is expected to accrue to the Fund. And the structure of spending in this Formula are aligned to Education Sector Priority Projects and Programmes.

The GETFund's liabilities and commitments as at 31st December 2016 stood at Gh¢3,733,831,937.36 (Three Billion, Seven Hundred and Thirty-Three Million, Eight Hundred and Thirty-One Thousand, Nine Hundred and Thirty-Seven Cedis, Thirty-Six Pesewas) with liabilities alone amounting to Gh¢951,773,445.64 (Nine Hundred and Fifty-One Million, Seven Hundred and Seventy-Three Thousand, Four Hundred and Forty-Five Cedis, Sixty-Four Pesewas). See attached sheet.

Mr. Speaker, this means the GETFund will not be able to do much based on the amount allocated to the Fund this year.

However, the new areas of focus in the 2017 Formula are:

- Fencing of schools with high risk of encroachment;
- Provision of white boards in Schools;
- Construction of Kindergarten facilities; and
- · Regulatory and Policy reforms.

Other components of these projects and programmes include the following:

- Academic Facilities & Infrastructure
- The Students Loan Trust Fund;
- Scholarships;
- Procurement of teaching and learning materials; and
- Demystifying and popularizing STEM/ICT.



SUB-SECTORAL ALLOCATION

Tertiary

The Tertiary Sub-Sector has been allocated **32.33**% of total spending to support a range of activities and interventions.

Secondary Education

This Sub-Sector has also been allocated **30.63**% of total spending. This is to facilitate payments for specific projects/programmes.

Basic Education

A total allocation of **28.19**% of total spending has been made for funding various projects and programmes in Basic Education.

Others

A total of **6.38**% of total spending has been allocated to the Ministry of Education and **Institutions** and **Agencies** within the Education Sector. This includes the GETFund.

MP's Emergency Projects and Monitoring

It is proposed that members of Parliament will receive support from the Fund to enable them undertake projects in their constituencies and, also to monitor these projects. For this year, an amount of Gh¢19,550,000.00 (Nineteen Million, Five Hundred and Fifty Thousand Cedis) representing 2.47% of total spending has been allocated for the purpose as against GH¢18,075,000.00 (Eighteen Million, Seventy Five Thousand Cedis) last year.

The specifics are:

- An allocation of Gh¢55,000.00 (Fifty Five Thousand Cedis) per MP as against Gh¢50,000.00 (Fifty Thousand Cedis) last year for the funding of Education Related projects in their constituencies, amounting to Gh¢15,125,000.00 (Fifteen Million, One Hundred and Twenty Five Thousand Cedis);
- An allocation of Gh¢15,000.00 (Fifteen Thousand Cedis) per MP as against GH¢12,000.00 (Twelve Thousand Ghana Cedis) last year for monitoring of these projects, amounting to Gh¢4,125,000.00 (Four Million, One Hundred and Twenty Five Thousand Cedis); and
- An allocation of Gh¢300,000.00 (Three Hundred Thousand Cedis) is proposed for the Select Committee on Education to undertake monitoring of education projects and facilities receiving funding from the GETFund.

Conclusion

In conclusion the **Fund** would like to express profound gratitude to Honourable members for the support given over the years. It is hoped that the cordial relationship between the **Fund** and this August House will get stronger and better.

The **Right Hon. Speaker**, I wish, therefore, to kindly request this Honourable House to approve the Distribution Formula for the Fiscal year 2017 as presented.
